This photo shows Elder Kesi.

Photo 2

This photo shows one of Elder Kesi's sons. He suffers from mental retardation, but he has never been examined by a professional doctor. In Mityana, mental health problems are often attributed to the influence of ancestors, and traditional healers are seen as experts in this area. We were happy to pray for Elder Kesi's son at his request.

Elder Kesi's wives, daughter and some of the grandchildren. They live in smaller huts around his main house. When we visited, they allowed us to pray over them and their children.

This photo shows Dr. Emmanuel on his graduation day, he received a bachelor's degree in human medicine and surgery. It was an honor for Mercy, Aaron, and me to witness Dr. Emmanuel take the medical ethical code and oath. One of the promises within that oath is to "first, do no harm to a patient." Emmanuel lived with us and served at the mission house during the second COVID-19 lockdown in 2021.
